

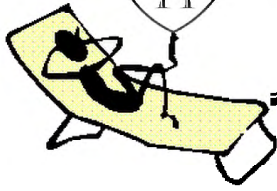

2013 LHS SUMMER TRIPS AND EVENTS:



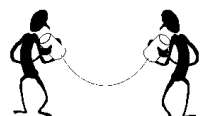

2. It is not too late to sign up for the Maidstone Museum trip on 2nd July – we meet at **12pm** outside the Methodist Church if you are offering a lift or need one. This is a change to the original meeting time.
The talk starts at 2pm in Maidstone Museum. We would remind you that there is a park & ride facility. We have provided a map of the area around the museum one for each car – please see Katharine for a copy.
3. August 6th the guided tour of Sandwich, we meet at 12pm outside the Methodist Church if you are offering a lift or need one. The tour starts at 2pm; we will announce via the July or August Parish Newsletter the venue once we have confirmation from the Sandwich Local History Society. Let Katharine know, if you haven't already, whether you will be going.

The talk in September is on the Kent Coal Fields by Jim Davies co-author of a history of the Kent Coalfield "*Invicta Coal*".

PUBLICATIONS

1. Today we have taken delivery of revised copies of the **Lyminge Guided Walk**. We will be replacing the copies of the earlier Guide in the shops with the updated version. Copies are available tonight at £2.00 a copy. The revision includes a lighter weight cover, updated text, refreshed and new photographs. Plus we have restructured the map to include some of the footpaths and the main thoroughfares of Silverlands.
2. Talking of walk guides – we hope, once we have reduced the stocks of the old **Etchinghill Guide**, to produce an updated version. We are talking to an Etchinghill member about this. If you would like to assist please let me know after the meeting.
3. **Lyminge a history Part 3** is selling well and I am pleased to announce that we have already covered the printing costs. If it continues at this rate we will have to have another print run soon.
4. **Part 4** of the *history* is on track and expected to be published by October in time for overseas posting and Christmas stockings.
5. **New Copy**. We are looking for local memories, stories, diaries, histories etc. for part 5. Please let us know if you have some to share or you know of someone who would like to share their memories of the parish.
6. We are looking at the possibility of producing a guide to the Parish Church's graveyard – this will be in a booklet form similar in style to the **Lyminge Guided Walk**. Gerry Darnley has turned in a superb analysis of the earlier grave plans and we are making arrangements for the data to be checked on the ground – so-to-speak, and added to where necessary.

THE ARCHIVE PROJECT

The Archive Cataloguing effort has borne fruit and we now have the majority of the *document archive* checked. Our dependable and much appreciated volunteers have provided us with the input sheets to create the catalogue.

We are now looking for more volunteers to help type up these sheets and create the online catalogue. Can you help? If you have used a computer can spare a little time your help will be greatly appreciated. Guidance and facilities will be provided.

Since then a further map – known as the Bedingfield Map dated 1685, has come to our attention and with agreement with the Rector we now intend to include a copy of this map as well. Placing *Street Furniture* in a public area requires permission. We are currently in negotiation with the relevant authorities to gain these permits.

2013 ARCHAEOLOGICAL DIG

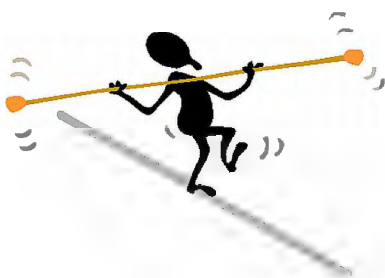
